Sodom represents <u>sin</u> in Scripture.

What starts off as shocking will eventually become <u>common</u> if we <u>immerse</u> ourselves in it.

If the opinion of others must be maintained, you'll <u>sacrifice</u> everything for your image.

Sin doesn't care about you, only satisfying its <u>appetite</u> more.

If it's not important to you, it will be a joke to your kids.

The life of sinfulness must be given up by <u>choice</u> – it cannot be <u>compelled</u> out of a person's heart.

God always <u>punishes</u> sin.

A life of sin makes the <u>beautiful</u> grotesque.

What starts out small (Lot set his face toward Sodom), often becomes a life-altering <u>departure</u> from the good.
